**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**

An Act requiring disclosure to consumers regarding home heating oil insurance.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 38J of chapter 148 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding after subsection (e) the following new  
3 subsections:

4           (f) Each retailer of home heating oil shall annually provide to each home heating oil  
5 customer a notice on a form prescribed or approved by the board of fire prevention regulations  
6 advising such customer of the availability of additional insurance for first-party property  
7 coverage for response action costs and for additional liability coverage for third-party claims  
8 arising out of a release of heating oil into the environment, as required pursuant to section 4D of  
9 chapter 175 of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on passage.
